



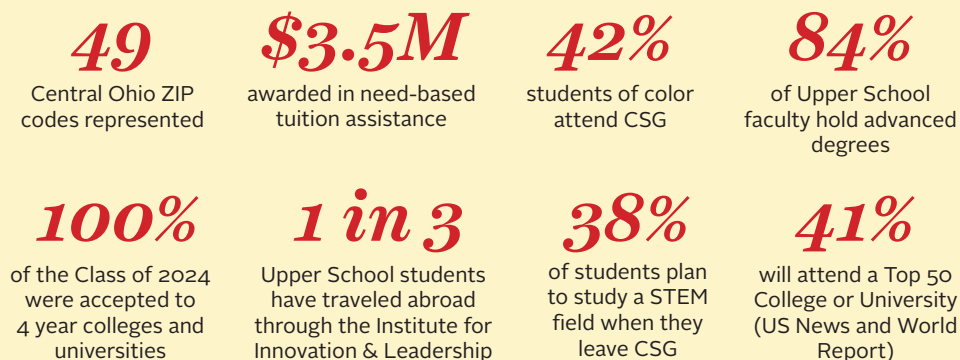

Founded in 1898 and located just east of downtown Columbus in Bexley, Columbus School for Girls is an independent college preparatory day school accredited by the Independent Schools of the Central States (ISACS). The CSG curriculum is designed specifically for girls age 3 through grade 12 with the mission of empowering girls to discover their distinct potential as learners and leaders. The 151 Upper School students reflect the diverse academic, ethnic, socio-economic, and religious backgrounds of the greater Columbus area. Each year, the school grants approximately \$3 million in scholarships, need-based tuition assistance, and remission. One hundred percent of CSG graduates are admitted to four-year colleges and universities.

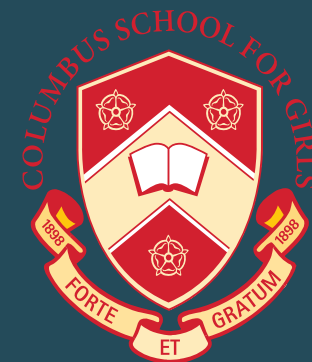

DIPLOMA DESIGNATION

Beginning with CSG's Class of 2025, students may earn a diploma designation through the Institute for Innovation & Leadership. In pursuing this designation, students will explore and develop their

interests and curiosity, experiment with new ways of thinking, delight in immersive experiential learning, and synthesize their knowledge and experience through an interdisciplinary capstone project or thesis paper in the junior or senior year.

Students who earn this designation will demonstrate a depth of engagement and an enthusiasm for learning while growing as thinkers, creators, and leaders. With specific criteria for each graduating class, students must complete requirements within three areas: **Institute and elective courses, experiential learning opportunities, and capstone project.**

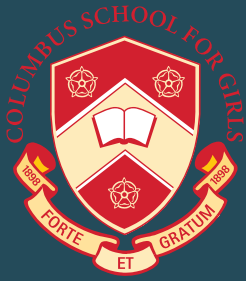

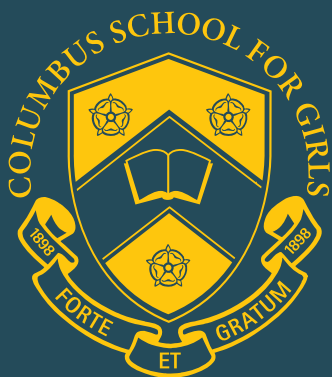
