Columbus School for Girls, founded in 1898, is an independent, non-profit, college preparatory day school serving 564 central Ohio students from age 3 through grade 12. The 218 Upper School students, 29% of whom are students of color, reflect the diverse academic, ethnic, socio-economic, and religious backgrounds of the greater Columbus area. Each year the school grants approximately \$2.0 million in financial aid. One hundred percent of CSG graduates attend four-year colleges and universities.
